With busy, cluttered backgrounds and subjects who don't know how to pose, how can you take control and get a great shot no matter the situation? In Picture Perfect Practice, photographer Roberto Valenzuela breaks down the craft of photography into three key elements--locations, poses, and execution--that you can use to unlock the photographic opportunities lying beneath every challenging situation. Valenzuela stresses the need for photographers to actively practice their craft every day--just like you would practice a musical instrument--in order to master the art of making great images. The first step to creating a successful photograph happens before you even click the shutter: the act of visualizing the final result--viewing the landscape in front of you and seeing, in your mind's eye, the final image that you want to create--is the true first act of the creative process. Once you know the end result you want to achieve, connecting the dots from capture through post-processing in Adobe Camera Raw and Photoshop becomes an intentional and logical act.
